Example

You might type:

I don't understand what break-even means.

The tutor might reply:

Break-even means the point where a business is making no profit and no loss. In simple terms: Total revenue = total costs. The business has covered all its costs. It is not earning profit yet, but it is not losing money either

Example:

If a business sells cakes, it might cost £100 to make the cakes and it might earn £100 from selling them. At that point, the business has broken even.

Why it matters:

Break-even helps a business know how many items it must sell before it starts making profit. It is useful for planning.

A quick memory tip:

Below break-even = loss

At break-even = no profit, no loss

Above break-even = profit

You could then reply:

That's really boring. Relate it to Arsenal football team and keep it short and clear.

The tutor might then adapt it:

Think of Arsenal putting on a home match day.

They spend money on wages, stadium costs, security and running the game. They earn money from tickets, food and merchandise.

Break-even is when Arsenal's match-day income exactly covers those costs.

So if they earn less, they make a loss. If they earn more, they make a profit. If it matches exactly, they break even.

That's it: no profit, no loss.

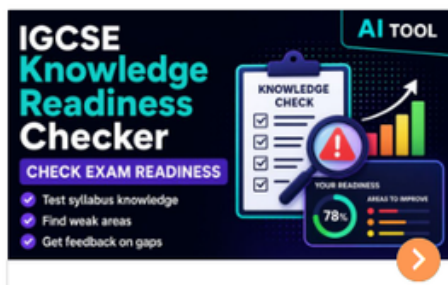

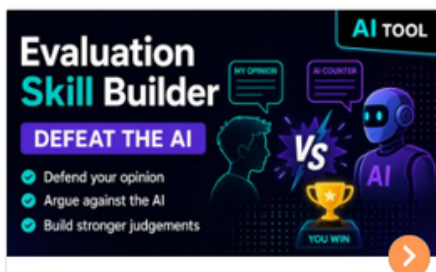
